

Lance-Sergeant Tom Bampton Lancashire Fusiliers Service Number 1589 Killed in Action 23/7/15 Aged 18 years Served France and Flanders Rue-du-Bacquerot (13<sup>th</sup> London) Graveyard Lavantie

LANCE-SERGEANY TOM BAMPTON, 50, Rochdale-road, Esst, Heywood.

Official information has been received that Lance-Sergeant Tom Bampton, youngest son of Mr George W Bampton, 58 Rochdale Road East Heywood has been killed in France. Deceased was 18 years of age and joined the Territorials in February 1915, after a recruiting meeting held at Heywood Picturedrome. He was connected with Heywood Unitarian Chapel and Sunday School. He was a draughtsman employed before war broke out at Messrs David Bridge and Co's works at Castleton. Another brother, Corporal George Bampton, is also serving with the 2/5<sup>th</sup> Lancashire Fusiliers in France, and he saw his brother soon after he was killed and was later present at his burial. The father of the fallen is Hon Secretary of Heywood, Norden and Bamford Executive of the Unionist party.

His name is on the Brittain Hill Unitarian Church Memorial He was born in West Gorton Mother's name Elizabeth Bampton
