The Annual Meetings of the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches will take place this year on the Jubilee Campus of the University of Nottingham from 8 to 11 April. The Bury Unitarian Church will be represented by Anne and Roger Mills, who will serve as the congregation's official delegates. Betty Kenyon and Molly Ratcliffe will attend as visitors. I will take part as your minister, but will also "wear a few other hats," as I facilitate a workshop with Dorothy Hewerdine on the visual cues congregations give to visitors for worship, host a book launch on behalf of the Unitarian Christian Association in my role as the current Moderator, lead a Taizé-style service for the Worship Panel, and present the annual report of the Faith and Public Issues Commission. The most important part of the meetings, however, will be the installation of our own Neville Kenyon as the President of the General Assembly for the coming year. This is the highest active appointment in our liberal religious movement, and one that commands a significant amount of time and dedication. We may not see as much of Neville as usual in the next twelve months, as he visits fellow-congregations, district associations, Unitarian institutions and societies that are affiliated to the General Assembly, and possibly the odd foreign country! What we can be certain of is that he will do his best to listen to the concerns of our fellow-members, and reflect on the great diversity that is our denomination's strength. It will be good to benefit from his observations at the end of his presidential year. We wish him well in his travels, and hope that he enjoys his role as ambassador to the wider community.

FAIR TRADE MATTERS

Our "Big Brew" coffee morning, held on the 3rd of March, was very successful; attendance was good, the event was enjoyable, and £177.17 profit was raised for church-funds. There was even a photograph and report in the "Bury Times"---excellent publicity! Many thanks to everyone who supported us on that morning.

Our Delicious Peace coffee, specially purchased for the occasion, was much enjoyed; beans were ground, and the coffee-pots were filled many times over. I am proposing to buy more packs of this coffee, in an international box, but I will need at least six definite orders before I can commit to this; the deadline for placing orders with me is Sunday,

the 4th of April, after which I hope to be able to contact The Thanksgiving Coffee Company, in California. Please be aware that the packets contain coffee-beans, which need to be ground, before the coffee is brewed in a coffee-machine or cafetiere. I expect each packet to cost approximately £7.00.

I was pleased that visitors from other churches in Bury attended our coffee morning; one such was Peter Roscoe, the Secretary of the Steering Committee for Bury's bid for Fair Trade status. Peter left a petition for us to sign, in support of the bid, and I was able to return to him two full pages of signatures, for which he was very grateful. Once the petition has been completed, it will be presented to the Mayor of Bury. We are also invited to attend the next meeting of the Steering Committee, which will be held on April 21st; unfortunately, both Jeff and I are on holiday then and unable to attend; if anyone else wishes to do so, in our stead, please speak to me, and I will supply details; it would be good to have a presence, on that occasion.
