#### MINISTER'S MONTH

I have recently been experiencing a sharing of worship with people from other traditions. During my holiday while in Wensleydale I attended the Quaker Meeting at Bainbridge. If I am in the Dales on a Sunday I really enjoy going along to share worship there. Although we have aspects of religious thought in common with the Society of Friends their worship is very different. Most often it is an hour of shared silence though occasionally someone will be moved to speak. I think the discipline of silence is a hard one and probably needs to be practised regularly before it feels totally comfortable. When you enter the meeting no one speaks though most will smile and nod as you take your seat. The meeting begins without preamble as if there is an unseen signal that everyone understands. I find entering into the silence affects me physically as my breathing slows and I become acutely aware of the quality of silent worship. The hour ends with a handshake and then with everyone shaking hands. I find the Friends at the Bainbridge Meeting some of the most welcoming people I have ever met. I always leave feeling refreshed. I could be a Quaker but I would miss singing hymns.

Then we had our annual visit from the congregation of Bury United Reformed Church. As I prepare the service I know that I want them to experience a Unitarian service but want that to be a positive experience. The hymns in the purple book were perfect for the occasion and some people remarked on this after the service. I wanted a subject for the sermon that was inclusive that spoke as much to their members as to ours and felt that the notion of sanctuary reached across all religious traditions. Speaking to a member of URC following the service she said she enjoyed the openness of our service, remarking that it didn't exclude anyone as some creedal services can do.

I don't know how many people realised but I have been on holiday for three weeks, during which we spent a few days with friends in the Lake District. On the notice board you will find a little card that I brought back with me from our visit to Brantwood, John Ruskin's house, on the side of Coniston Water. Look a little closer and you will see that it is about the newly refurbished toilets there. Not many people bring back souvenirs of toilets I hear you say, quite so, but these are special toilets. They are truly splendid and well worth a visit, the tiling is amazing. The ladies loo is decorated with a desert island/jungly theme and the men have a sea theme with fish etc. Best of all the refurbishment was funded by the Bowland Trust which is Unitarian. I even went to the trouble of buying a leaflet to put on the board – have a look at it. Next year's trip perhaps.
