NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL: 12-12-11

A minute's silence was observed, in memory of Jean Kenyon.

A meeting to assess the Bazaar had been held, on 17-11-11, and points raised will be borne in mind for next time.

Finance: Thanks were proposed to Roger for all that he does for the church. Work on the car-park is now complete. Problems with the heating continue to be investigated. Council-approval is **always** required before the worship-area is let, and before any Saturday-evening letting. Janet was thanked for her work in sorting out the Performance Licence material.

<u>Treasurer:</u> The quota has been paid for 67 members. By the end of 2011, we will have spent approximately £23,000, against income of £19,000—a deficit of £4,000.

Efforts: Dates have been arranged for events in 2012; these will include a weekend of celebrations for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, in June. "Sunshine Smarties" will collect 20p pieces, in 2012, in an attempt to update and rejuvenate the scheme.

<u>Communications and Worship, with Young People:</u> It was agreed that 10 more purple hymnbooks should be bought. Further discussion about the vestry ensued.

<u>The Minister</u> has received a reply to her letter to Churches Together, and this is on the notice-board. There was discussion about music used during services, and the minister's input.

<u>Charity:</u> Our charity for 2012 will be The Samaritans; a representative of the local branch will speak about their work, during the service, on 29-1-12. Many of the charities we have previously supported display trees during our Christmas Tree Festival, and good links are being forged with the community. Events for 2012 have been arranged; the first of these is a Quiz, with Pie and Peas Supper, in February.

The Membership Secretary reported that 5 people had applied for membership of the church.

NELUM: Les and Doreen have resigned as our representatives; they were thanked for their efforts.

G.A. Delegates: Neville and Betty have volunteered to represent us.

The Congregational Meeting will be held on 19-3-12; the April Council meeting will be held on 2-4-12, when the motions for the G.A. Annual Meetings will be discussed.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Beryl has received a letter from the Council, asking whether we would agree to archive-material from Bank Street Chapel to be released to Ancestry.com. After discussion, it was agreed that Beryl should proceed, at her discretion.

It was agreed that, in future, Church Council Meetings would start at <u>7pm</u>, thus coinciding with the Yoga start-time.

NELUM REPRESENTATION

We now seek at least one person to represent us at Nelum meetings. These meetings take place at the different Unitarian churches of the area, in rotation, and are held every other month, in the evenings; the AGM is held in March, during the day, on a Saturday. Ideally, we need a replacement immediately, but, failing that, after our Congregational AGM. If you feel able to help, please speak to Anne Mills.

TRAIDCRAFT

The stall will be open on February 5th and February 19th. In 2011, takings from the stall were lower, by approximately £300, to £2,300; prices have risen considerably, even though I have made every effort to contain them. We did not have a specific Fair Trade fund-raising event, during the year, although a tasting of products took place in Fair Trade Fortnight. On the whole, trade has kept up, despite the fact that the stall operates fortnightly, now, instead of weekly. Most of the items sold are purchased from Traidcraft, but I also buy regularly from The Co-op, The Ethical Superstore and Just Trading Scotland, so that we can enjoy a wider range of goods. Since I began to sell fairly-traded products, just over nine years ago, a profit of £1,400 has been raised for the church.

Thank you all for continuing to support this important venture. *Anne*

USE OF THE VESTRY

Council again discussed this matter, at its December meeting. The Vestry is primarily for the use of the minister, and strangers should not be brought into the building, unless on church-business and accompanied by a church-member. It was decided that some of the lower corridor cupboards would be suitable to use for all incoming post; Anne will identify suitable cupboards, and keys will be made available, as required. Council will be informed, once these changes have been implemented. Church-members are reminded that telephone-calls from church-premises should be church-related; if not, please use the honesty-box in the kitchen-storeroom. Remember that <u>all</u> outgoing calls are charged, even if they are unanswered, and Directory Enquiries, which were once free, can now be very expensive.

There has been an improvement in the way we use our vestry; let's see whether we can continue with this, without further measures having to be taken.
