TRAIDCRAFT

Happy New Year from Traidcraft, and many thanks to everyone who has supported the stall during the past year! Just a reminder that, from now on, the stall will be open on the first and third Sundays of each month---that's the 2nd and the 16th, in January---but please don't go without items, at other times; ask me, and I can easily fetch whatever is needed.

During 2010, we sold £2,500 worth of fairly-traded goods---a slightly lower amount than last year; whilst this is an excellent result, it must be remembered that sales are down, and prices are up. Let's hope that 2011 will see an increase in sales again; every item sold helps the community which produces it---not only financially, but also in terms of providing, for example, better housing, education for young people, and improved water-supplies.

We are now into our 8th year of Fair Trade; since we started, the sum of £1,193 has been paid into churchfunds; and this represents profit from the Traidcraft stall; in addition, all the stock is paid for. During 2010, I have purchased goods from various sources, including The Ethical Superstore; this enables me to keep prices down and to offer a better variety of items. Hopefully, in 2011, I shall be ordering from Just Trading Scotland, who supplied us with our rice for the Rice Challenge; amongst their suppliers is a firm called Buchanan's, who produce a range of fairly-traded sweets, including Blackcurrant and Liquorice. Watch this space!

CRAIG HOUSE

Craig House is to undergo major refurbishments. Early in the new-year, exterior reparations will be carried out over a 3 month period. These will involve re-locating the entrance door to the opposite corner of the Bank Street aspect, cleaning or replacing windows, pointing some of the brickwork and re-surfacing the road alongside the building. The newly renovated building, to be let as offices, will be known as "The Exchange"

The owners, Seddons, will be using the car-parking spaces alongside the building (including ours) for site-cabins and material storage. During the works, alternative parking will be made available to us under the canopy opposite our front door. They will be restricting our regular access from Bank Street during the refurbishment works, leaving our normal vehicle access from Back St. Mary's Place. Of course, pedestrian access alongside our church will remain.
