NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL - JUNE 10TH

A minute's silence was observed in memory of June Seddon, whose friendship and commitment were remembered.

Matters arising

- The new church notice-board looks splendid.
- The new sound-system is now fully-operational.

Finance

- A decision has been taken not to buy Performing Rights licences and to refrain from activities which would incur such costs.
- · We need stewards for most Monday and all Wednesday evenings.
- We hope to hire performance lighting during the Harvest weekend
- Live giving is falling, yet costs are rising.

Treasurer

Our Income and Expenditure, over the first 4 months of this year are level; our current balance is healthy; however, electricity and gas costs are set to rise, and this will mean an overall increase of 47% in this area and will take us over budget; John was thanked for his very sophisticated accounting-system, which enables us to exercise good control of our budget.

Communications and Worship, with Young People
