Rene was active in the wider Unitarian movement, too; she served as NELUM Treasurer, for several years, and was also Treasurer of the Padiham District Women's League; at Rawtenstall, she did a stint as Women's League President, and she was named as an Assistant Registrar for the church; she represented Rawtenstall at G.A. Annual Meetings, in different places, and she was at the Carmarthen Meetings, in April 1994, when Rawtenstall won the Amy Howarth Rosebowl for the congregation which had most increased its membership during the past year; Rene and Sheilah Stott were presented with the rosebowl by Jeff Teagle, the then National Secretary of the G.A.

Rene will be greatly missed by her family, but she leaves behind many good memories of happier times.

We are always happy to hear from any new recruits who can help with our various processes. We extract items of interest from the newspapers and journals which cover Bury and surrounding districts and these are put onto CD's, memory sticks and audio tapes and sent out each week to our register of listeners. We operate from the Seedfield Centre, off Walmersley Road and the time commitment is just a few hours once a month – mainly in the daytime from Tuesday to Friday, or, for recording, Thursday evening.

At the moment we are particularly keen to find a few more volunteers who can help us with editing i.e. selecting from local newspapers and journals items which would be of interest to listeners and would be included in that week's recording. Editing takes place on Thursdays, from mid-morning. No special skills are required and we train all new recruits alongside existing volunteers.
