POINTS OF INTEREST FOLLOWING THE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 8 FEBRUARY. 2010

- It has been agreed to purchase a second microphone to be fitted on to the lectern in a similar way to that on the pulpit.
 This will allow a more flexible use of the microphone system as a whole. It is acknowledged that we still have, as yet unidentified, random faults on the lapel microphone used by the Minister.
- Attempts are being made to alter the heating system so that certain areas can be zoned off when not in use, in the hope that we can reduce our annual gas consumption. At present if the heating is required to be on in one area then we have no choice but to heat up the entire premises.
- A budget has been approved to refurbish the primary room and also to create a children's area at the rear of the church. It is considered important to provide the small number of children we do have with a pleasant environment and also equally important to provide an area in the church where children and their parents will feel welcome.
- Anne and Roger Mills have been chosen as our representatives at the GA Annual Meetings to be held in Nottingham from 8th to 11th April.

SPEAKING OF...

Gill Pearl, Chief Executive of the local charity, "Speakeasy," spoke to the congregation in the course of the Sunday morning service on 7 February. She explained how a person's speech could be affected by the onset of a stroke, or a similar brain injury, and outlined the ways in which professional and voluntary assistance is given to members of the community by this particular charity in order to cope with the realities of living with brain aphasia.

It has become a tradition in recent years to "kick off" the year's fundraising efforts on behalf of local charities with a special service, in which the congregation is able to learn about the work of a charitable organisation, and also meet both representatives and service users of the designated body. Gill spoke informatively and sensitively, and was happy to chat over coffee with members of the congregation. Let's hope that we manage to raise a significant amount of money for this worthy charity, and enjoy the events that are planned for the remainder of the year.

IN MEMORIAM

The life of **Dorothy Whitworth Hayward** was celebrated at a service held at the Overdale Crematorium in Bolton on Monday, 8 February.

The minister officiated. Dorothy had been a member of the old Bank Street Chapel congregation, and had also been associated with the Ainsworth Presbyterian (Unitarian) Chapel. The service was attended by many friends and members of her extended family, who acknowledged her plain speaking and quiet generosity. She died after a long period of hospitalisation at Fairfield Hospital in Bury, at the age of 90.

The funeral service for the late **Bertha Shipley Schofield** took place at the Rochdale Crematorium on 15 February. The minister officiated. Bertha had been a member of the congregation of the Unitarian Chapel at Britain Hill in Heywood, and had marked important occasions in her family's life at the old Bank Street Chapel and at the current Bury Unitarian Church. The service brought together her extended family of children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and members of the wider community, who honoured her life's role as a homemaker, carer and peacemaker. She was 98 years-old at her death.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN BURY

The first Churches Together meeting of 2010 was held in February at Bury Unitarian Church; 9 people attended, thus representing 6 of the 8 participating churches of Bury town centre. The Reverend Ruth Woolaston, of Bury United Reformed Church, chaired the meeting.

The main topic of the meeting concerned the Good Friday Walk of Witness which will take place, this year, on April 2nd. The route will be the same as last year's, beginning at St. Marie's and ending at the United Reformed Church.
