LAUNCH OF OUR PROSTATE CANCER SUPPORT GROUP

To that end, the Charity Committee have already had two meetings with Yvonne Trace, the Support Group Development Officer for Prostate Cancer UK. Yvonne has shown herself to be extremely knowledgeable as regards setting up such a group and has offered a great deal of practical assistance in the early stages of our project; we are grateful for the amount of work she has willingly taken upon herself. Plans are now at an advanced stage, and the Inaugural Meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 17th, between 7 and 9 p.m. The format of the evening will be a welcome from Beryl, who will outline our intentions in setting up the group; Yvonne will then explain her rôle, and she will be followed by a clinician, who will speak in general terms about Prostate Cancer; refreshments will be served, and there will be an opportunity for all present to chat informally. The Deputy Mayor and Mayoress will also be present.

Church-members have already shown great interest in the new group and have helped by distributing posters and flyers around the town. Please spread the word about our Prostate Cancer Group and its meetings---the more people we can attract, the better. Everyone is welcome at the Launch, on March 17th, and at the First Meeting, on Tuesday, April 14th, again between 7 and 9 p.m. Let's hope for a successful outcome, on both occasions.

My aunt Emily, who was one of the Chesham Minstrels, did our make-up while telling me not to sing but just to mime. And if you never saw Molly as Principal Boy slapping her thigh you really missed out. Thanks for the memories Pat. Memories which made me realise that the church today does

very different things and may seem to have changed completely but I think under the surface the important things endure.
