MINISTRY MEETING

INDUCTION SERVICE

Kate's Induction will take place on Saturday, March 4th, 2017, at 2 p.m. The service will be conducted by Rev. Cody Coyne, of Cross Street, Manchester, and the sermon is to be preached by Rev. Jim Corrigall, of Padiham, Rawtenstall, and The Lancashire Collaborative Ministry. The GA President is to be present, as are our MP and his wife, and the Mayor of Bury and his Consort, in addition to various dignitaries, representatives of other Unitarian churches, and representatives of local churches. The Choir, augmented by members of Roundelay, will offer special musical items. The service will be followed by a buffet tea. As we are to be the hosts of a large number of visitors, on this occasion, we should all make a special effort to welcome our visitors. The Induction of a Minister represents a statement of good intent---an acknowledgement that we endorse and support the work of that Minister in our church. The Ministerial Appointments Group felt it important to mark Kate's service, thus far, even---and especially---at this early stage of her time with us.

PARKING

Just a reminder that both The Exchange and the residents of St. Mary's Place have asked us not to occupy their parking-spaces, <u>at any time.</u> Our own parking consists of the back car-park (at the weekends, and between 6p.m. and 9 a.m. on weekdays) and the two spaces immediately adjacent to the church; these are usually reserved for the Minister and the organist, on Sunday mornings. Previously, we have been accustomed to using Back St. Mary's Place, the covered area opposite our front door, and the spaces in front of The Exchange, but none of this belongs to us; it never has. The Exchange, in particular, is now taking action against anyone who parks in its spaces; if you do so, be prepared to face the consequences! Up to now, we have remained on reasonable terms with our neighbours, and it is desirable for this situation to continue. <u>Please:</u> use your parking-permits, at all times, and make every effort to comply with requests; your co-operation is much appreciated.

FIRST AID COURSE

A Basic First Aid Course has been arranged for Saturday, May 13th; it will be conducted by Judith Jones, of The British Red Cross, on churchpremises, and will be free to all church-members who wish to attend; it may also be thrown open to others. The course will commence at 1 p.m. and will last for about two and a half hours; we need a minimum of six people for the course to run. Participants will receive a Certificate of Attendance, but there will not be an exam at the end. Subjects to be covered will include what to do in case of heart-attack, stroke, choking, unconsciousness, and broken bones. Best of all, you do not need to get down on the floor, although you may do so, if you wish!

It was a delicious treat this last month to do the baptism service for Hope Maden Hunter. A third generation baptism, no less! It was lovely to see the church full and for there to be so many children and young people. We're really lucky at Bury to have a small but regular core of children for Junior Church, and it's fabulous when they join in so well. I hope everyone takes a bit of time to talk to them sometimes!

By the time you're reading this, we'll have had the church pie and quiz night, which I'm very sure I will have won with a massive lead. If for some

bizarre reason I didn't, I'm sure it was because I generously allowed someone else to get ahead. Joking aside, it looks as though the quiz – quite apart from being yet another lovely social event – will have raised considerable funds for Streetwise, our chosen charity.

I'm so proud to be part of a church which looks outside itself and gives help. That is what a church is for – if all we do is support our own members and our own needs then we may as well not consider ourselves religious at all. There will be gifts for people participating (they may be very low value gifts, but gifts nonetheless!)

This month sees Lent, Mothering Sunday, and the equinox – that time of year when the days and nights are of equal length. By the time of the next calendar the clocks will have changed and we'll be heading towards Easter and all the special services that will bring. This year, that's going to include an inclusive communion service on Good Friday, as well as the service on Easter Morning.

As always, I'm keen to continue getting to see people either in their own homes, or in the vestry, or the Art Gallery Tea rooms. I really appreciate people's hospitality when I've visited, and I'm thrilled that people are increasingly dropping in to see me in the vestry or the tea rooms.
