## **DEMOCRACY IN ACTION**

I am writing my contribution to the May edition of the church calendar on the day that the Prime Minister has asked Her Majesty The Queen to dissolve Parliament in order that a General Election might take place on 6 May. The date itself is not a surprise, as nearly every political commentator, town hall and election official in the country had reckoned on that being the most likely day for the ballot. What is surprising is the nation's apparent uncertainty as to which party should lead the nation out of recession. Conversations revolve around the possibility of a hung Parliament, and supporters of minority parties are excited at the prospect that their leaders might exert some degree of influence in the formation of a coalition government, or at least be consulted over the composition of a new ruling structure.

As we endure together the coming four weeks of electioneering, what place does our faith hold in the process of assessing the candidates for our local constituency, and what role do our religious convictions have in determining which party is to receive our allegiance? There is a consistent voice that calls for civil and religious freedom in our small but influential dissenting tradition, and that voice has often spoken out in favour of sections of our society that the political parties failed to consider in their plans for the future. Have we any equivalent concerns today in modern Britain? Are there people or groups of people for whom we should have a special concern as the politicians talk about "a more just society" and "fairness for all"?

On 6 May 2010, I encourage you to exercise your right to vote. In the weeks leading up to that date, I would also encourage you to examine the policy statements made by the local candidates and by their party leaders, and judge them in the light of your faith. *"Truly I tell you: anything you did for one of my brothers here, however insignificant, you did for me."* [Matthew 25.40]
