Kate is hoping to visit Bury, before her ministry begins, so we shall look forward to seeing her again during October. The work of this group will last until the start of October, and one further meeting will probably be necessary; after that, the Ministerial Support Group will come into operation, the members of which will be the Chairman of Trustees, the Chairman of the Congregation, the Church Secretary, and the Chairman of the Communications and Worship Committee. Formal announcements of Kate's ministry will be made, once she begins her work with us.

#### THE SING-A-LONG BAND CONCERT

What a thoroughly enjoyable evening we had, full of melody and atmosphere! Egged on by the Band, we sang our hearts out (but still had enough voice left for Sunday!) to old favourites---amazing how many of them we remembered, when it came to the crunch! We found we needed constant liquid refreshment to keep our throats irrigated---very important, in the circumstances! Thanks to all those who supported this event; more than £300 was raised.

We continue to be grateful to our service-leaders, each week, and offer thanks to Sarah Simpson-Bostock, from our Ansdell congregation. Sarah's service, on August 28th, had a very Japanese flavour, and she linked her theme to a Japanese proverb: "Fall down seven times---jump up eight times". Those who observe this instruction display qualities of perseverance and determination, which, in religious terms, translates into ideas of belief and faith. Sarah's service encouraged us to follow the path described, and proved inspirational.

Marian Price, on the first Sunday in September, revealed her talents as a member of the Worship Support Group; it is heartening to realise what a wealth of experience we have to draw on, from amongst our own congregation---a very valuable resource! Marian's theme was that we should have confidence in our own abilities---in ourselves---to live life to the full, by extending our boundaries, and by not being unduly fearful of the unknown; in this way, we grow, improve, and achieve more than we might imagine; although this may be a practical proposition, on the face of it, it links clearly with the spiritual aspect of our lives. Marian's service was very well-prepared and delivered, and her theme was reinforced with humour, via her story of the baby owl and her two poems; as we laughed, we realised the more serious implications of what she was saying---a triumph, indeed!

Thank you to both ladies for sharing their thoughts and feelings with us; there was much to contemplate in both services, and much to pursue.

On Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September, at the church followed by interment at Bury Cemetary, the funeral of Sheila Houghton wasconducted by Reverend Beryl Allerton. Sheila was a long-standing member of the church and a church trustee. She will be remembered with affection.
