Letter from the Minister

Dear all,

We're past the Equinox, the clocks have gone forward, the daffodils on the roadsides are rampant, and Easter is just over a week away. Admittedly, we haven't had a decent drying day in what feels like months and months, but the winter is definitely over.

Last weekend we held our Annual General Meeting, and although these meetings always involve an awful lot of work for the Church Officers and the Church Council, it's a huge blessing and a privilege to be able to be a part of making decisions for our community: meetings can feel like a chore, but they're much more than just that. Worship and spiritual practices:

Sunday Services

We continue to meet on Sundays at 11.15am to worship together. The service lasts around an hour and is followed by refreshments and conversation.

We also hold Sunday Zoom services on the second Sunday and possibly the fourth Sunday of each month: there will be a Zoom service on Sunday 9th and Sunday 23rd April.

Inclusive Communion Services

We generally hold an inclusive communion service on the first Sunday of each month, at 12.30 (after the main service). The next one will take place on **Sunday 30th April:** everyone is welcome to this simple and sacred sharing of food, juice, and community.

You're very welcome, even if you've never been before.

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Midweek online meditations:

The meditations have resumed, and the next will take place on **Tuesday 11**th **April at 7pm**: please let Kate know by Monday morning if you would like to come along, otherwise we will postpone until May.

Lectio Divina Sessions

Lectio Divina sessions are planned for **Sunday 2nd April**, **Sunday 16th April**, and **Sunday 30th April**. They will take place shortly after the service finishes (and after communion if they fall on a communion day). Hannah will confirm details as soon as she can.

Good Friday Communion

I will be hosting a short Good Friday vigil and communion in the worship area at **3pm** on **Friday 7**th **April**. Everyone is very welcome to join us for this quiet and contemplative service.

The service does, of course, mark the crucifixion of Jesus, and is free Christian in nature, but it is inclusive of people of any faith and none.

The service will last around forty minutes (perhaps an hour), and we will meet in the lounge for coffee and hot cross buns afterwards.

You are very welcome to join us just for the hot cross buns if you'd like.

I will be holding a Vestry Day on Good Friday as usual, but finishing slightly early to prepare for the vigil.

Notes from the building.

If I were to describe the function of our beautiful building, I would say it is simply the physical property that allows the church to operate and that the more important bit is that the church is all of us. This is the ethos I take into property management at the church, and this is the time of year we have an awful lot of the little things that need to be done to make the building a safe and secure sanctuary for our individual bodies, as well as our collective 'soul'... our church.

From gas certification and electrical work to fire equipment and lift testing, there's an awful lot of work going on in the background of the building at the moment, and while it is work that you don't really need to know about; there is a reason that I mention it here.

There is a lot of work very obviously not getting done at the moment and almost all of this is directly tied to the aesthetics of the building. There are things to hang, floor pieces to affix, parts of the ceiling to repair and so on, and none of that really obvious work is getting done, because there is so much work to do at the moment on safety, or contract work that has to take precedence because, as I have mentioned, that is the work of maintaining the core of the building, and that has the greatest potential impact on our church.

So if you hear me wandering around the building singing parodies of Christmas carols such as 'tis the season to be busy' or 'Where are ye Mr Leccy-man' (to the tune of God rest ye merry gentlemen), it isn't because I'm losing my mind... I'm just engaging in something to turn the interminable chore of chasing contractors around town into something essentially joyous. I'm basically trying to play a trick on myself, and fortunately, it frequently works.

If I can take out all of my frustrations in an empty church through the medium of song, then when I do get a contractor in we can have a very positive engagement. That is important because welcoming people into the building kindly can be an important first step in welcoming them into our church, and maybe, just maybe, our church is where they too might actually belong. So if you come in one day and I'm singing to myself? Well, now you know why.

By-Gone Times no. 34 by Betty Kenyon:

What's in a name?



First Chapel 1719

Probably the oldest document relating to Bank Street Chapel, is a passage in the will of Samuel Wareing who died in 1717. In it he leaves £100 for the minister of the chapel that shall be built in or near the town of Bury for the Dissenters for the worship of God.

Others who gave fairly large sums of money were Richard Kay, Robert Wareing and Brother Hampson.



Second Chapel 1837

In 1735 Mary Kay of Baldingstone left £10 for the support and maintenance of the Presbyterian minister. This is the first time Presbyterian is used but only for the minister. The people who formed the congregation were called simply 'Protestant Dissenters' the words used in the Act of Toleration of 1689.

In 1735 in the earliest Minute and Account Book we read of a Vestry Meeting held at the Dissenting Meeting House in Bury. By 1816 mention is made of the 'Old Meeting in Bury'.



Third Chapel 1852

In 1883 'The Unitarian Chapel' was the given name.

However, Bank Street Presbyterian Chapel was its more recent name.



Fourth building, 1974

This changed in 1974 to Bury Unitarian Church when Chesham and Britain Hill Church, Heywood joined.
