MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Firstly, Happy Christmas!

Or, at least, happy advent, then happy Christmas, and then a very happy new year.

This is my second Christmas in Bury, and the first when everything hasn't been new and shiny and strange. It's still shiny, but not so new anymore, and definitely much less strange. And the church plans for the advent and Christmas period are well underway and very exciting.

On the 2nd December eighteen of us are going to The Nightingale Centre in Hucklow for a Christmas lunch. Some of the group have never been to Hucklow before, and many have been, but not for a very long time.

On the 3rd the service will concentrate on decorating Christmas trees - the big one will already be up and, I'm sure, splendid, but we will be decorating two or three others. I am also adapting an old Bury Unitarians tradition, and placing a memorial tree in the vestibule. You are invited to use this tree to place a bauble and a label in memory of a loved one: everyone remembered on the tree will also be remembered in our prayers.

On the 10^{th} we have our glorious candlelit carol service at 4pm, and on the 17^{th} we are joining together for lunch and a costumed reading of A Christmas Carol.

There will be a service and then a communion on Christmas Eve, and on Christmas Day our normal

Christmas service will be preceded by bacon sandwiches for anyone who would care to join us for that.

Full details of the December services are elsewhere in the calendar.

And church life will continue as normal. I will continue making visits, and I hope people will continue to make use of my vestry days when that feels more appropriate to them: Christmas is a glorious time of year but it can also be a hard one. Please let me know if you'd like to see me at church, at my home, or at yours. If you know of anyone else who'd like a visit, please tell me that as well.

On the subject of telling me things, I know that some of you haven't liked some of the changes that have happened in services. When that's the case, please tell me. Also, please tell me if you do like them. I'll continue to try new things (if we don't change we die), and some of them won't work. But please tell me, not someone else. I'm very happy to receive criticism, but much less happy when it comes second-hand. My dream church is one in which people communicate clearly and directly and honestly and with love, and we can all play a part in making that happen.

As for 2018, I predict more change, more glories, and more challenges. And I give thanks in advance for all of those things!
