UNITARIAN COLLEGE MANCHESTER

The training centre for Unitarian ministers in the North of England is at the bottom of the "Curry Mile" in Rusholme. The Unitarian College Manchester will hold its end of session proceedings on Tuesday, 8 June, beginning with an act of devotion led by the current students at 3.45 p.m. The Reverend Principal, Alex Bradley, will deliver his first annual report, and then the Principal of the Northern College (United Reformed Church), the Reverend Doctor John Campbell, will speak on the topic, "Whose God? Which Story?—Deciphering the palimpsest of Palestine." A buffet tea will then be served in the college dining room. The events will conclude with a valedictory service at 7 p.m., in the course of which Mr Danny Crosby and Mr Bob Pounder will officially conclude their studies and attain the status of an accredited minister. The address will be given by the Reverend David Shaw, the newly-appointed minister of Upper Chapel, Sheffield, and the former minister of Old Chapel, Great Hucklow. It would be good to help our former ministerial student, Bob, celebrate this milestone in his life by attending either the entire day's proceedings, or just the valedictory service in the evening. IN MEMORIAM

The ashes of former Bank Street Chapel and Ainsworth Chapel member, Mrs Dorothy Whitworth Hayward, were interred in the Garden of Remembrance at Ainsworth Unitarian Chapel on Sunday, 9 May. Dorothy had died on 27 January this year, and her funeral service took place on 8 February at the Overdale Crematorium in Bolton. The minister officiated at both services.

The funeral service for Mrs Marie Stella Lupton took place at the East Lancashire Crematorium in Radcliffe on Friday, 21 May. She was known as "Paddy" since childhood, and moved to Epworth Grange in Bury in the last year of her life in order to be closer to one of her daughters in Prestwich. Her attendance at church services and events soon became important to her, and she often remarked on how warmly she had been welcomed into the life of the Bury Unitarian congregation. The service of thanksgiving for her life benefited from the contributions of her daughters, Jane and Sheila, and her grandchildren. The minister officiated and Mr Harry Taylor provided organ accompaniment to the hymns. Paddy died after a brief hospitalisation in Fairfield Hospital on 14 May at the age of 88.

From Monday, 21 June to Wednesday, 23 June, I will be in the city of Oxford in order to take part in the annual meeting of the Old Students' Association of Harris Manchester College, of which I am President this year. The theme of this year's gathering is "Towards a Theology of Unitarian Ministry," and invited speakers will address the topic from a variety of perspectives. I have been asked to conduct the Annual Service on the final day of the proceedings in the college's chapel, in addition to chairing the lectures, workshops and Annual General Meeting.

It will be good to spend some time with colleagues and friends amidst the "dreaming spires" of the ancient university, and to focus on a subject that lies at the heart of my own vocation. The collegiate environment can be rather intoxicating at the end of Trinity Term in Oxford, as finalists parade round the city streets dressed in their required uniform of 'subfusc,' in order to sit their examinations, and people punting on the Rivers Cherwell and Isis can be seen testing their navigational skills! It does feel somewhat like a scene from 'Brideshead Revisted,' but the reality of it all does sink in when there is work to be done.

I am looking forward to this year's gathering of the Old Students, and am delighted that it will include the valediction of the college's final year student, Mr Daniel Costley, who is a member of our sister congregation in Horsham. No doubt, I will have a good deal of information to share with the congregation on my return, and may even have learned something that I can pass on directly or indirectly. My 'alma mater' calls . . .

Concern was expressed that local convenience-stores stock little fairly-traded food, such as bananas, and that awareness of and publicity for Fair Trade Fortnight, in such stores, had been almost non-existent, this year.
