Rawtenstall's Film Evenings continue to be well-attended; full details are on our notice-board. SITUATIONS VACANT Anne would like to hear from anyone in the congregation who would be willing to take over the job of liaising with the church-organists; duties are few and not onerous; they involve keeping in touch, usually by email, with our regular organists, Chris and Barrie; the rota is very settled and low maintenance; there is occasionally a need to advise changes of time or date; and holiday-vacancies also need to be filled; we have a reserve organist, who is usually available at short-notice. JEAN JONES The flowers in church, on May 26th, were donated by Peter Jones and family, in memory of Jean; Peter chose this date, particularly, as Jean's ashes were interred then, in the churchyard at St. Leonard's, Sandridge; this is where Ronnie's (her husband's) ashes were scattered, and the church is close to the care home where Jean lived for the last few years. Thanks to Peter for his generosity.

A plaque in memory of Jean has been ordered and will be placed on one of the choir-stalls, as close as possible to Jim's Pollitt's; Jean and Jim were good friends and often sang together. We remember both of them with affection.

300TH ANNIVERSARY COMMITTEE The group met on April 27th. A special Anniversary leaflet has been prepared, ready for distribution at the Senior Moments Concert, and at the unveiling of Victoria Wood's statue. Planning for the Heritage Weekend (September 20th-22nd) and the Anniversary Service (December 1st) is in hand, and filming towards the DVD continues. We are compiling a list of special guests to be invited to the Anniversary Service; if there is anyone you feel ought to be invited, please have a word with a

member of the committee; invitations will probably be sent out towards the end of June. Our roll-up banner has already attracted attention; it will continue to be displayed prominently, throughout the year.

MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS GROUP The last meeting was held on April 12th. The GA Feedback Service was discussed, and the date and speakers decided. The unveiling ceremony for the Victoria Wood statue was also discussed, and the use of the gardens was referred to the trustees. James Frith's request to hold his constituency surgeries on our premises was similarly referred. Kate again expressed a wish for everyone to discuss their opinions and comments directly with her.

MEMBERSHIP SERVICE This had to be postponed from April 28th, on account of Harry Taylor's ill-health; we hope he will soon be back with us again, at church, so that his welcome may proceed.

On May 5th, Ian Barlow was formally welcomed as a member of our church. Ian and his family are well-known to many of us, from former days; he has returned to the UK, after several years of working in America, and is busy settling into a house in Haslingden. We wish Ian well, in the future, and hope he will find fulfilment in his membership.

I am massively grateful to everyone who contributed to the day, by stewarding and helping out, and particularly to Anne for acting as the Authorised Person (without an Authorised Person the marriage is not legal!) and to Cody Coyne from Cross Street Chapel in Manchester for officiating at the service. Our next wedding is that of Lorraine Maden and Peter Hunter, in August, and it will be an honour and a treat to officiate at the wedding of two such valued members of the congregation.

May was a rich and busy month. Following the success of the quiz evening, five of us visited Grace's Place, the children's hospice for Bury, Rochdale, and Oldham to hand over the money we raised and to have a tour of the hospice. It was both heartwarming and heartbreaking to see the facilities and hear about the work the hospice does and the families it supports. Only 4% of their funding is statutory, and the rest comes from donors like ourselves. I

hope that we can provide further support to them in the future.

Later that same week we were treated to an evening of light entertainment from 'Senior Moments', a very talented duo from a local WI, and our very own Sue McMullen (described in the Bury Times as "Sue McMullen, 75, from Brandlesholme"). Both halves of the evening were delightful and it was lovely to share an evening of giggles and fun.

And then on Friday 17th, we played a part in the unveiling of the statue to Victoria Wood. This has been a long project (I knew it was in the offing before I moved to Bury, and that was two and a half years ago), but I think it's been worth the wait. She is now standing proudly at the front of our gardens, looking out over the library. The day itself felt like a rather lovely garden party, and we were able to throw our doors open to the Brighthouse and Rastrick band, half of Bury Council, and a few celebrities. I've said it before and I'll no doubt say it again: I was proud of the building, of course, but I was even more proud of the fact that everyone I spoke to was very complimentary about the welcome we showed. It really is a hallmark of our church that everyone says "you were all so nice!"

Looking ahead, the big event in June is our Strawberry Tea, on Saturday 22nd. This is always a lovely affair, and it's another opportunity to show our welcoming nature.

And now for the weather! I think we can now safely say summer is here. Everything is at its lush, green, rich best, and I for one am absolutely loving the long evenings (we get a good half an hour more sun in the evenings than my friends in East Anglia!). There's something very luxurious about not having to turn the lights on until late in the evening, even if there is the odd day where we want to pop the heating back on.
